Details of CSR Projects

FY 21-22 projects:

1. CIIE.CO

We have funded CIIE.CO, one of India's leading incubator and accelerator, to promote fintech start-ups working for the Low and Middle Income segments in India. Our support will be used to offer financial support, training and mentoring support and other relevant assistance to enable start-ups to validate and scale innovative inclusive lending models.

2. Collective Good Foundation

We have partnered with Collective Good Foundation for two programmes:

Pay for Performance programme

Strengthen financial resilience and credit worthiness of bottom of the pyramid microentrepreneurs and banking correspondents by enabling behavioral change through a financial literacy and training programme and a one-time grant on timely repayment of loans.

Returnable Grants programme

This programme seeks to empower underserved women artisans from vulnerable communities lacking creditworthiness and financial footprint to afford loans from mainstream providers. Through this programme, women artisans are provided capacity building and working capital through a zero-interest returnable grant to enable them to manufacture their products with a moral obligation to repay. The funds returned will be revolved towards another cohort of women artisans.



FY 19-20 and FY 20-21 projects:

1. PARFI (skill development and learning outcomes project)

We have funded Pan IIT Reach for India (PARFI) Foundation to enable income and employability enhancement for underprivileged youth through skilling and placement. This is an outcome based, pay for placement programme that seeks to economically empower underprivileged youth in Jharkhand through a residential training programme and job placement. The youth supported under our programme have been trained and placed in various vocations within the construction, manufacturing and apparel industries across six states in India.

2. Project Urja

Project Urja by Raah Foundation, focuses on women empowerment by promoting financial stability and inclusion through entrepreneurship among tribal women Palghar. The programme aims to build wealth at bottom of pyramid by providing requisite capacity building, training and creating entrepreneurial opportunities in the area of financial services, compact farming, tailoring, nursery and vermicompost. Further, this programme also entails returnable grant funds for the Vermicompost, Nursery and Krishi programmes where in revolved funds will be utilised for a new set of beneficiaries.

3. Development of Maa Baadi centres

We have extended support to Tribal Area Development Department (TADD), via the IIFL Foundation, for redevelopment of 30 Maa Baadi centers through introduction of Digital leaning tools, extensive learning resource (library & toys), access to hygienic water & sanitation facility.

4. COVID Relief

During the COVID crisis, IIFL Wealth has expanded into more community-based interventions, via Vathsalya Charitable Trust to provide relief and support to underserved communities. We also contributed towards distribution of food relief kits for around 300 families in Turbhe via Fueladream and responsenet.

5. Nutrition project

The Ashwini Charitable Trust educates and empowers underprivileged children from urban slums in Bangalore and supports them till they are gainfully employed. The Protein Mix Programme enables preparation and distribution of small, packaged nutrition mixes to underprivileged children and their families and has benefited approximately 1500 individuals in Ulsoor, Bangalore.



6. iMobile and Lab on Bike programme

We offered support to Agastya, a charitable education trust, that runs the world's largest mobile hands-on science education program for economically disadvantaged children and teachers. Their Lab in a Box is a great resource for government school teachers to execute hands-on science activities on a regular basis. The iMobile program addresses the need for a blended learning of both science and digital.

7. Scholarships to students

Swades Foundation works towards empowering rural lives under four key thematic areas namely Health & Nutrition, Education, Water & Sanitation and Economic Development.

8. Support towards running of Ekal Vidyalayas

We have supported 23 Ekal Vidyalayas operated by Bharat Lok Shiksha Parishad in rural and tribal villages, where they monitor Ekal schemes in remote tribal/rural areas, resource management through donor cultivation, quality updating by regular supervision, periodical evaluation of the work and training of Ekal Teachers and volunteers.

9. Project Rashtriya Netra Yagna

We, along with the Vision Foundation of India, aim to treat underprivileged individuals across India by operating them free of cost, thus improving their quality of life and enabling them to lead better lives. The primary objective is to reduce avoidable blindness among the underprivileged sections of society who have minimum or no access to eye care.

10. Medical equipment for treatment of patients

We have contributed towards medical equipment that will be used at Deenanath Mangeshkar Hospital and Research Centre to treat patients from low-income communities free of cost. This is in association with the Lata Mangeshkar Medical Foundation.

11. ISKCON

Preparation and distribution of free meals to individuals from underserved communities in Delhi.
